Upcoming Events

Monterey trip (August 3- 5) – we will send emails to those members making this trip with any last minute details associate with this trip.

Revised schedule for balance of 2006 – at this time, the following dates and places will comprise the balance of our schedule for 2006: Monday, August 28 at Ancil Hoffman, Sunday, September 24 at Poppy Ridge, Saturday, October 7 at Haggin Oaks (Alister MacKenzie), and Saturday November 4 at Lincoln Hills (Orchard). Previously listed possible event dates of August 21, September 9, and October 14 will not have CGC events.

Over the past few years, CGC members made up the bulk of our players for some USGS events we had on Mondays and Fridays – so let's see how we do with a Monday event of our own. Results from Diamond Oaks, July 15, 2006

There is just no getting around it – it gets hot in Sacramento in July!! Fortunately, we were able to get starting times at Diamond Oaks beginning around 9:00A, so our group of 36 players (34 CGC members) was able to get out fairly early and avoid the worst of the heat. While the course didn't give up any really low net scores, half the players shot net par or better – an indication that 1) the course is quite fair, and 2) during the summer months when we all get to play a little more golf, our games get a little sharper. As we noted afterwards, Diamond Oaks requires a hefty prize fund per person as part of the contract (\$13.50 per person compared to \$5.00 per person at most courses), so our payouts were a little larger and a little deeper than at most events.
