Upcoming Events

Dry Creek, Saturday September 15 (9:30 A start) – a long time favorite of the CGC – it should be in good shape this time of year. Definitely one of the best older style courses around (tree lined fairways and small greens). Results from Central Coast weekend, August 2- 4, 2007

The early returns seem to indicate that the 22 players (19 CGC members) who made this trip enjoyed the unique golf of the Central Coast. The courses were probably much hillier than most expected, with each course providing a variation to the terrain. Dairy Creek, a late addition in place of Hunter Ranch, is a younger and more open layout – with a fair share of forced carries and doglegs. Morro Bay is a much more tree lined, with wide fairways and no forced hazards – but constantly sloped. Chalk Mountain brings the trees closer to the action, with more up and down hills and a few forced carries. All public course venues, this trip was all about the golf. The golf scores were quite consistent throughout the trip, with about 7-8 players breaking net par each day.

The weather was also uniquely different at each venue – Dairy Creek, not being far from the ocean, was very pleasant, sunny, a bit breezy (with the breeze having a coastal feel). Morro Bay was definitely coastal – the only true disappointment being the lack of ocean views (due to the fog and overcast) that can be so spectacular, especially on the more elevated front nine. Very comfortable while playing, we only got a late peek at the sun. Chalk Mountain returned us inland, and gave us a reminder of our return trip to Sacramento with low to mid 90 degree temperatures – but fortunately a bit of breeze throughout the day.

We think there was enough enjoyment of the courses and the area to consider a return trip in 2-4 years – however, being a little longer travel, we will definitely involve the membership as to their interest in returning before scheduling. The goal of our away trips is to include as many members as possible, so we will not push the longer trips too often.

While next year is originally scheduled as a ‘Monterey’ year, we are initially looking at two other options for early June 2008 – Graeagle (if we can get Grizzly Ranch included in the rotation) and Mount Shasta (figuring early June gives us a decent weather opportunity in the Shasta area). Monterey is a pretty good ‘third’ option. If we do schedule Graeagle or Mount Shasta for 2008, Monterey will become our 2009 trip.

Miscellany...just missing out on the 3 day payouts was a common theme in all 3 flights, as Robert Barth (First Flight, 220, lost tie-breaker), Stella Garin (Second Flight, 221), and Carol Fieldhouse (Third Flight, 213) were so close to breaking into the top 3 in their respective flights...there must be something to golf lessons, as Carol Fieldhouse, Donna Johnson and Jim Rohrer have all shown marked improvement in their games after recent lessons – Carol has dropped her index by almost 7 strokes so far this year, Donna led the 3rd Flight after 2 days (net 135) before struggling on the 3rd day, and Jim, who shot a gross score of 162 at our Rancho Solano event in early May, broke 100 for the first time with his 95 at Chalk Mountain...the group made 16 birdies over the 3 days (multiples by Ronda Barth and Alan Rankin, 2 each)...after a wild and wacky Monterey trip in 2006 where 19 shots were made from off the green, a more mild total of 9 was made during this trip (2 by Shelley Barr)...the easiest hole, statistically, over the three days was the Par 3 4th hole at Morro Bay (118 and 101 yards respectively), as only 2 of the 22 players shot over bogey on this hole...the hardest holes, statistically, were both long uphill holes, the 9th hole at Dairy Creek (393, 370 and 317 yards respectively) – where only 2 pars and 3 bogies were made among the 21 players, and the 13th hole at Chalk Mountain (381 and 326 yards respectively, the last 175 yards straight uphill) – where 0 pars and 7 bogies were made among the 22 players.

In recent years, we have had problems with small amount prize payout checks not getting cashed in a timely manner, if at all – we realize in these times of direct deposit and automatic banking that there is no great incentive to go to the bank to deposit a \$ 6 or \$ 9 check.
